Renewal | Romans 12:2

I am excited about being the new faculty director of Course of Study at Wesley Theological Seminary. One of the reasons I am excited is this is an amazing time to be in ministry. We are experiencing tremendous opportunities and challenges. Paul obviously knew this time would come because he tries to prepare us for it in this Romans text. Paul tells us “not to be conformed to the pattern of this world.” It is easy to translate this simply as the world or culture on the outside and us needing to not be conformed to the pattern of the culture. I believe we should also think about the world or culture of our congregations and the need to not be conformed to patterns that are not missionally driven.

Over the last several years we have made changes in the way in which pre-course assignments for the July Intensive term are received by the school and faculty. Some of these changes have been an attempt to use technology to enhance the process. I know there are those of you out there who would not agree with that statement, however, the Blackboard system is a tool for education, nothing more and nothing less. If we were able to use this system well it would help everyone communicate more efficiently.

Dr. Powe and I have reviewed the feedback we received from this past summer's student body. We heard everything from "we turned in our papers on time and had a restfilled time of retreat" to "spent the entire time writing papers—very stressful". We would like to move the experience on campus more toward retreat and sanctuary, and away from the stress that is induced by writing pre-course work during the program. To that end, Dr. Powe and I have been working to find a way that makes sense both for time management for the students and turn around for the faculty. It is equally important that papers are returned on time that are submitted on time.

The requirements for pre-course work that we receive from the General Board for Higher Education and Ministry states,

"Advance preparation is required of all students. Some of this advance preparation is to be done in conjunction with a clergy mentor. Assignments will include material related to classroom studies as well as experience in pastoral ministry. Each school will determine the nature of the advance preparation required for the students."

After much discussion and consultation with student representatives and faculty we are implementing the following for this coming summer:

- 1) Students will be required to write a 10 page double spaces paper for each class **due June 1 via Blackboard** for students enrolled in 200-500 level courses. Assignments will be outlined on the study guide posted on the website.
- 2) Students will turn in **an additional 10 pages or writing the first day of class**. All students will be required to do this. For

those in 100 level courses, you will turn in two—10 page assignments the first day of class as outlined on the assignment.

- 3) Students will have on campus assignments in addition to the pre-course writing. These assignments can take many forms from reflection papers, quizzes, discussion, group work, field trips, presentations, so on. Some will take place in the classroom (i.e. class participation), some will need to be prepared outside the classroom and turned in the next day. The scope and type of in class assignment will be at the discretion of the faculty teaching the course.
- 4) **Faculty will return papers received by the June 1 deadline to the students before the last day of class.**

Our hope is that having two shorter writing assignments that are due at different times will help lessen the stress felt by so many of you and allow you to enjoy the other activities that take place on campus such as Worship and Enrichment. We pray that your time on our campus is a time of renewal, a time away from the stress of church-life and that you allow yourselves to drink of the spiritual friendships that abound between local pastors.

But times are changing and with the dominance of on-line booksellers and e-books the Cokesbury management in Nashville has decided to shutter all their brick and mortar stores in favor of on-line retail. Wesley COS School Site Visit and Review – Rescheduled

The General Board of Higher Education and Ministry is beginning a new round of site visits and school reviews for all the Course of Study Regional and Extension schools. Schools related to the Candler Course of Study program were reviewed last year. This past summer schools related to and including the Wesley Regional school were to be reviewed. Due to the departure of Dr. Kisker we have asked the GBHEM to reschedule our review until next summer. Therefore, the Regional school site visit will take place during the last week of classes, July 28–29, 2014. The Philadelphia Extension schools review has been completed and the Buffalo Extension school is being reviewed in May 2014.

These visits play an important part in assisting the Division of Ordained Ministry to assure integrity of the program across all the schools as well as maintaining a seamless education for the students who attend more than one location. We will call on students, faculty and administrators to be a part of the review next summer. Many thanks in advance for being a part of this important process.

Have YOU Thought About Advance COS?

To qualify for probationary or full conference membership local pastors need to complete a total of 32 semester hours of graduate theological studies or the equivalent as determined by the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM).

Advance work enables local pastors to meet the educational requirements for full conference membership and ordination as an elder. This work is done after a local pastor has completed the five year basic Course of Study School and have obtained a bachelors degree.
