After completing the other readings, I would like students to browse in Buber's collection *Tales of the Hasidim* (available at many libraries and cheaply second-hand) and choose 1) one story you believe conveys the nature of human beings, 2) one story that discloses something of the nature of God, and 3) one that particularly speaks to you of your own relationship with or experience of God. You are to write a brief (500 word) explanation of why you chose these three stories, and what truth you think they convey. Then I want you to tackle the following question: "Clearly these are narratives: are they theology? What case could you make for saying yes?" For the essay on whether these stories constitute theology or not, I expect 1000 words (3 pages.) This assignment presupposes that the other assigned reading has been completed, and I expect to see this reflected in your work.
