Methodist founder John Wesley famously declared that the whole world was his parish. His theological heirs have often appealed to that phrase to support their sense of mission to the world. This Doctor of Ministry track will prepare participants to lead their congregations or ministry settings in a way that is grounded in the Wesleyan/Methodist tradition and, from that foundation, creatively engages with a diverse, globalized, and interconnected world.
