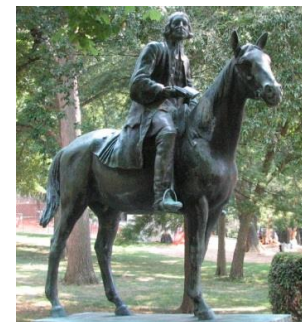


“The World is my Parish”: Engagement with the World from a Wesleyan/Methodist Perspective (2020)
