

Track Objectives: Students will be able to enter into diverse cultural communities with an openness to encountering, contributing to, and learning from different cultural perspectives. Students will be able to work effectively with others to facilitate their gifts for service and leadership in the church, in community organizing, and in the public square. Students will take responsibility for directing their learning for more effective leadership engagement in the public square.

In addition, students must take the project seminar and two elective courses for a total of 30 credit hours.

Project Seminar: The project seminar is offered several time during the academic year. It is required for graduation, requires the completion of 24 credits, and should be taken no later than the summer term 2023 for graduation May 2024.
