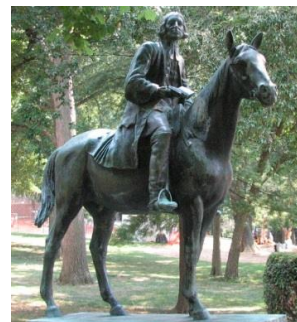


“Forward by Grace: A New Methodism for a New Day”

Doctor of Ministry Program • Begins January 2021

In 2021, the political and organizational shape of The United Methodist Church will become clear. The majority of pastors in the U.S. are eager to move beyond the present debate to design and lead congregations which are broadly inclusive, incorporating the disruptive challenges wrought by the pandemic, the recession and the new civil rights movement; seeking both personal and social holiness as well as an economically viable model for a new Methodism. This Doctor of Ministry track will be a cohort of pastors, working together to craft a vision for these congregations with each other in real time. The program of study will be launched by two leaders in our denomination and use the resources of a strong faculty and the Lewis Leadership Center and will result in project/theses grounded in a Wesleyan practical theology.
