

Dr. Anthony Carr is faculty of the University of South Carolina and Assistant Director of the Center for Community Counseling. He served in the Navy as a chaplain from 2003 - 2013 and is adjunct faculty for Wesley Theological Seminary.

Dr. Sathianathan Clarke is Professor of Theology, Culture and Mission, Bishop Sundo Kim Professor of World Christianity at Wesley Theological Seminary.

Dr. James Driscoll is a retired US Army Chaplain (COL-Ret.), United Methodist clergy, adjunct faculty, and Special Assistant to the President at Wesley Theological Seminary.

Dr. Denise Dombkowski Hopkins is Professor of Hebrew Bible, Woodrow W. and Mildred B. Miller Professor of Biblical Theology at Wesley Theological Seminary.

Dr. Michael S. Koppel is Professor of Pastoral Theology and Congregational Care at Wesley Theological Seminary.
