

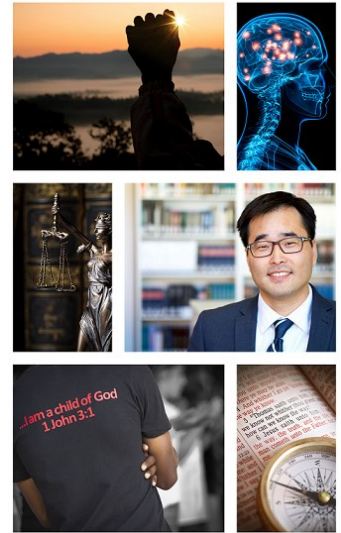
Trauma, Moral Injury, and Christian Life

It is not, however, adequately studied or acted on. What more, the imperative has become more apparent, and urgent, due to the worldwide pandemic caused by SARS-CoV-2, which has killed more than half a million in the United States alone. It is in response to this imperative that we propose a DMin track focused on “Trauma, Moral Injury, and Christian Faith.” The church must learn the reality of trauma and its effects and respond with wisdom and knowledge and with love and compassion.
